A Festival Review from South of the Border

After having missed two years, the Newcastle Jazz Festival was on again this year from 19th to 21st August, and it was a great event. I won't be going into great details about bands, as I'm not "qualified" to comment on that side of things, and we could not possibly see every single band, but the ones we did see/hear were great. Newcastle Jazz Club Committee with their many volunteers did a wonderful job of putting this together and running the whole event over the weekend.

This year being the 33rd Newcastle Jazz Festival, it was held in the iconic Newcastle City Hall, which apparently was its former home for the first 25 Jazz Festivals, and is a beautiful venue. Within the one building there were 4 rooms/halls that all had bands playing in them all weekend. It is a multi-story building, so it worked well, and there was a bar in 3 of the rooms, plus one also had food and coffee for sale and there was plenty of room for people wishing to dance. All under one roof!!

Friday night we spent most of the night in the Concert Hall and heard some great "Big Bands", which Dennis really loves. For the last hour we went to the "Cummings Room" and heard "Heather Price and Dungeon Small Band", which was made up of Heather, her father and her brother, plus a "mate". It must be wonderful having a "family band" like that and they really "bounced off each other" (with humour) during the evening. We heard them again on Saturday as they all also played in the "Dungeon Big Band: 'Blues in the night' ".

Saturday was another enjoyable day and bands like the "Newcastle Army Band" and "Swing Company" were fantastic. Many players from the "Newcastle Army Band" also played in the "Rehab Brass Band". Having played in the Army Band himself in the 70's Dennis really relates to this music.

We also listened to "The Smoothie Kings" with Rachel Hamilton on piano. We have heard Rachel in Newcastle previously and she also came to Ballarat (with family and other Newcastle musicians) for the last Jazz Convention held in Ballarat. Well "The Smoothie Kings" was a "treat" too. As I sat down I studied the other players' names in the program, to find that Rachel's husband was the Sousaphone player and they had their two sons playing Cornet and Drums. David Saxon on Trombone is Doug Saxon's son, and fifteen year-old Ella Saxon (vocal), is David's daughter, so a proud Doug Saxon's granddaughter. I really enjoyed Ella's, "My Sister Kate" and "Silver Bell" (being 2 songs I personally like). What a great "family affair"! There was also Jack McLaughlin on Clarinet and Tom Tyler on Banjo.

Saturday evening kicked off in the Concert Hall with "The Roaring 20s' New Empire Ragtime Dance Orchestra" which I have heard before when in Newcastle and absolutely love. They did the first 2 sets, so played for 2 hours and I sat through the whole lot, and the two hours went much too quickly.

Dennis went to the "Banquet Room" for the second hour as he wanted to listen to (Sydney trumpeter/trombonist) Al Davey, who he had heard at the last Jazz Convention in Ballarat, and was playing in the Banquet room. He enjoyed that too, and a very lively "Zackerbilks" finished Saturday evening off for us.

Sunday started off in the Concert Hall with "Gospel Jazz — Geoff Power Jazz Band with Lee Gunness" followed with a very lively and colourful "Umbrella Parade" accompanied by the "Rehab Brass Band". We were sitting in the "Dress Circle" so had a "birds eye view" and it was "magic". The sound of the music, the colour, the joy, the liveliness of it all was just a pleasure to watch and hear.

In the afternoon we enjoyed "Fish Fry" who we had heard at the 2019 Newcastle Festival, and didn't want to miss (particularly as they only played once during this Festival). "Fish Fry" is a very lively jump/jive band with Justin Collins on vocal. Justin is extremely full of energy and doesn't stop through the whole



hour. He sings, jokes, and is physically active the whole time and comes down into the crowd, involves the audience and is great to watch. Great entertainment with a great band!

We finished Sunday off with "Andrew Dickeson's Blue Rhythm Band", for another listen to Al Davey. Yes, he is a beautiful trumpeter, but Dennis also envies how "laid back" he is and how easy he makes it look.

I noticed during the weekend that many of the bands thanked Doug Saxon for his work, so it's obvious that the bands appreciated all he did as Band Co-ordinator. The Newcastle Jazz Festival was a real credit to the whole Newcastle Jazz Club Committee, and their many friendly helpers. It was a really enjoyable weekend. We plan to be back next year!

In recognition of his service a special presentation was made to Rod on Sunday 4 September.

Rod's journey began in 1993 when the Central Coast Jazz Club which operated at Woy Woy announced it was closing. Rod asked the Central Coast Leagues Club if he could start a Jazz Club at the Leagues Club and they said 'Yes' as long as it was an internal club.

The first President was Jean Tonnzing and Rod was Vice-president. After 6 months Rod took over as President until he stepped down in 1997 to become a carer for his Mum. Later Rod moved from Holgate to Gosford and resumed his involvement with the Central Coast Jazz League which was to last over 20 years.


