Vale Garry Walford: New Orleans meets Balmain in spectacular send-off for local jazz legend Sydney Morning Herald February = 2023. Story Nick Galvin.

'The passing of major public figures is traditionally marked by all the hoopla of a state funeral. But in Australia, even the greatest luminaries are not accorded the ultimate musical send-off: a genuine New Orleans brassy jazz procession. That singular distinction, which briefly brought Balmain to a standstill on Wednesday, is reserved only for jazz royalty. And no one fits that description quite so well as the legendary pianist Gary Walford, who died last week aged 74.

Every week, for the past 50 years Walford and a revolving cast of some of Australia's best jazz musicians played at Balmain's Unity Hall hotel in what became the longest running gig in the world. It has become a Sydney institution and Balmain's St Augustine's Church was packed with mourners, many of them the cream of the Sydney jazz scene.

After the service, about 20 musicians formed up to escort the hearse along Darling Street to the Unity Hall pub, leading off with *Nearer My God to Thee* before swinging, inevitably, into *When The Saints Go Marching In*. Leading the parade was veteran trombonist and bandleader Dan Barnett who, more than 20 years ago, got his first big break playing with Walford.

"When Gary asked me to join the Unity Hall band, it changed my life," he says, adding that being on the bandstand with Walford and so many veteran players was a baptism of fire. "I was getting a real jazz education, like a Louis Armstrong type education. If you didn't know something, the guys would either get cranky with you or help you out depending on who was on the gig.

"Barnett says Walford had a uniquely recognisable sound on the piano, born from his early love of rock 'n' roll. "He had his own way of playing," he says. "He defined the sound of the band from the piano he played. It's a really distinctive semi rock 'n' roll way to play he learnt from listening to people like Jerry Lee Lewis."

Walford's own big break came when his mother hired Geoff Bull's Olympia Jazz Band to play at his 21st birthday party. Walford played a few numbers and Bull immediately recognised his potential. Before too long he was a fixture in that band. "He became, as far as I'm concerned, and I think everybody else, the best New Orleans style piano player in the country," says Bull.

Beyond his music Walford loved rugby league (Balmain Tigers) and a daily punt. Even when he wasn't playing, he was a familiar face at the Unity Hall hotel, nursing a schooner of Carlton Draught. Known for his modesty and never comfortable in front of a mic, he preferred to drive the music along from the back of the bandstand rather than taking the limelight.

"You know, in some ways he would probably be a bit embarrassed that we're talking about him," says Barnett. * You can view a video of the jazz parade after the funeral by Googling 'Garry Walford'. Our patron Bob Henderson was one of the musicians in the parade as well as Paul Furniss, Eric Gibbons, Geoff Bull and Andrew Dickeson.

On Sunday 5 March (we) Half Nelson presented a birthday gig in honour of our fearless leader Mr Jason Nelson. The event took place at Bartholomew's in King Street Newcastle. The venue was formerly known as Babylon but had to undergo a name change to avoid litigation. Blame the lawyers! Half Nelson played at the opening of Bartholomew's (Babylon at the time) back in August 2018. Since then, we have had an ongoing romance with Bartholomew's and have played there on a regular basis. We were discussing with the venue about some new dates earlier this year and it was decided that we should have a gig on the 5th of March and could make it a birthday celebration for Jason (trombone).

You may have seen my incessant posting about the gig on Facebook and Instagram. If you didn't you probably are not following me, and I need you to go to Facebook and Instagram straight away and follow me!

The band were in fine form with Tim Evans on drums, Carter Smyth on piano and Adam Ferrier on trumpet. We also had the fantastic Andrew Wallace (Wal) on bass for the gig and we had some local favourites do guest spots. A highlight of the day was a beautiful rendition of Cole Porter's, I've Got you Under My Skin featuring Andy Firth on clarinet. It was a captivating performance with an outstanding solo from Andy. The line-up was later joined again by Andy Firth and also Jeremey Borthwick on trombone for Mack the Knife and Bohemia After Dark. The crowd were wowed by the four-piece horn section. Wish we could have that all the time. I'll have to speak to management.

The show was attended by a full house downstairs including jazz club members Barb Bucknor, Trevor Burndred and Val Jones, local jazz fans, some old friends of Jason's from his art school days in the 1980's and also our parents Carmel and Ian Nelson. Members Casey Sherry and Simon Baker kept the dancefloor warm. They were accompanied on the dancefloor by local trumpet player Laura Sands' two daughters Billie aged 6 and a half years and Annika aged 5 years who busted out some pretty cool moves. Great to see our up and coming jazz fans hitting the live gigs. Laura plays with Fish Fry and performed at our free concert last year with the band. Laura was appointed official photographer for the day and she is responsible for the great photographs that accompany this piece.

I promised that there would be cake for the gig and I was assisted by my friend and local singing lawyer Lauren O'Brien in constructing a three-tiered cake decorated with edible discs printed with various pictures of Jason's face, two of his favourite trombone players Frank Rosolino and Carl Fontana and also a trombone playing cat. Yes, that's what I said! See accompanying pics. The cake was played into the hall led by 13-year-old Miles Street from Sydney who played happy birthday on the trombone. Not a single piece of cake was left and even Jason didn't get a piece!

Thank you to all who came and made this a great day of live jazz and fun. I love being in a band with my brother and I wanted to make his birthday a special celebration, and I think we achieved that. We had a few apologies from friends and members, we know who you are. Thank you to Bartholomew's for their continued support of live jazz in Newcastle. Happy birthday Jason!
