From the President Hello Jazz Lovers

Alex loaded in and freshly minted VP Murray Scoble and I sprang into action setting up the PA during the first set. Luckily I've had about 15 years of experience setting up a PA with Half Nelson so I had half a clue of what to do. Murray took direction like a champion and halfway through the first set we were wired for sound! What a roller coaster! The day was a great success and I enjoyed a few spins around the dance floor with new volunteer raffle ticket seller Amy and also long standing member Janette West, up the back near the bar. What fun!
