Newcastle was supposed to host the convention again in 2023 but due to the cost of hiring the Newcastle City Hall the venue for 2023 has been changed to Longford, near Launceston, Tasmania where most of the venues are available at minimum cost but not under the one roof. David Lole, jazz pianist, well known to many Newcastle Jazz fans suffered a major heart attack at the end of the Jazz Convention and was in the ICU at John Hunter Hospital when he passed away on January 7.

Our thoughts are with David's family and the many friends he had in the jazz loving community. David played in eight bands at the Jazz Convention and was joined in some of these bands by Newcastle musos, Sheriden & Jason Nelson, Chris Dawson, Jim Lyons, Peter Buckland.





One of the featured bands at the convention was the Nicki Parrott Trio (Nicki - double bass/vocal) with Andrew Dickeson (drums) and Peter Locke (piano) pictured above. I was fortunate to be able to hear two of their sets.

Nicki grew up in Newcastle and moved to New York in 1994 with her sister Lisa (alto/baritone Sax) where Nicki became the bassist for Les Paul in his trio's weekly performances at a club in Manhattan. Nicki remained in the USA until she moved back to Australia in May 2022 with her husband- an American record producer.

Some of the tunes presented included Fever, Straighten Up and Fly Right, How High the Moon, You make me feel so Young, What Lola Wants, Lola Gets and a wonderful version of Sweet Georgia Brown . Another song C'est si bon really summed up a great performance by Nicki. Andrew and Peter. (both with Newcastle origins).

Celebrating Long Time Jazz Musicians

Two long time Sydney jazz musicians, Billy Burton and Valda Marshall were recently featured in the media.

Billy Burton, 90 still plays trumpet at the Avalon Bowling Club and was featured in December in a story aired on the ABC's 7.30 Report. It is a wonderful segment that you can watch simply by Googling Billy Burton Trumpeter. The segment includes commentary by bassist Craig Scott. and Gregg Arthur who was the vocalist with the band when the ABC filmed Billy's 90th birthday gig.

The Sydney Morning Herald ran a story by Angus Thomson *'Valda can't read music but plays in a band at 95.'* The story read in part:

'When Valda Marshall's jazz band started playing at the Hero of Waterloo in The Rocks in 1977, she was in her 50s and thought she was only going to play for a couple of days. Forty-five years on, her original bandmates have died and the pub has changed hands, but she still plays alongside a rotating crew of musicians at one of Sydney's most storied watering holes every Saturday and Sunday afternoon......

Marshall grew up in a musical family in Sydney's inner and eastern suburbs, first in Zetland and then in Kingsford, where she still lives. Her mother played piano, and she started playing music from about 5 years old, although she didn't pick up a saxophone until she was in her 50s. A natural musician, she taught herself.

"I started on the trumpet but got osteoarthritis in my back, so I couldn't hold it up," she said. "I wanted to keep up the music, so I thought, 'blow it, I'll get a saxophone. I can't read the music, I just know what the sounds are."

All the Best Ian Goodier- Ian, President of Geelong Jazz Club has had to retire as president due to ill health. Ian and his wife Susie have previously been to Newcastle for our jazz festival.
