Jazz in Newcastle

When I was asked in 2017 by Ron (from U3A) if I would do a talk on Jazz in Newcastle I initially thought, 'What can I talk about for an hour and a half?' I could talk about how I developed my interest in jazz from about age 14 after hearing this exciting music on the wireless (I was allowed to listen as long as it wasn't too loud!) and later, after my marriage to a jazz musician in 1963, my involvement in the jazz scene. Well, all I can say is thank goodness I decided to ask Rod Barnes and Doug Saxon to talk to the U3A members as well, to give them a broader picture of the jazz scene in Newcastle.

I had read about a Swing Jazz Club in Newcastle in the 40s and knew about the Australian Jazz Conventions held in Newcastle (I helped at both) and of course I also knew the history of the Newcastle & Hunter Jazz Club and the Newcastle Jazz Festival, so I decided to try and find out more about the early days of jazz in our city.

From my own research, assistance given by Roland Bannister through his ephemera and the notes of Ray Scribner and the writings of Bill Haesler OAM, I have unearthed a remarkable history of Jazz Clubs in Newcastle since the 1930s.

So..... the following is an incomplete and potted history that evolved. I will apologise at the start for any errors and omissions.

Jack Sinclair (bass player) and other local musicians and list formed a listening group. They became the first recorded jaz

THE NEWCASTLE JASS SOCIETY APPRECIATION OF JAZZ GROUP This was organised by Greenwood, Sinclair and Sutherland who were pioneering jazz collectors and S of the best collection of discs in the State became a legend in the annals of Australian Jazz history. Phys. MELODY, CLUP.

2HDs 'MELODY CLUB' Instigated by radio announcer, Allan Cairnes. Mainly a record listening club but supported occasionally by a 'Dixie' band Led by Les Dewes (piano) and Eric Boyd (Trumpet) and others. This club lasted for about 6 months.
THE NEWCASTLE JAZZ CLUB Organised by two very enthusiastic record collectors, Robert G Smith and Raymond Scribner. The club lasted for 7 glorious meetings before becoming defunct!
HUNTER VALLEY JAZZ CLUB
THE JAZZ CLUB

Commenced on 27 September 1959 in 'The Rendezvous Coffee Lounge', Latec House in Hunter Street and enjoyed packed houses and prosperity until its demise in 1960. The Club during its 'life' was very active holding weekly meetings, riverboat cruises, barbecues, 'rorts', cabaret balls, radio sessions etc and fostered local groups and musicians, including Jack McLaughlin, Roland Bannister as well as Sydney musicians. Eg. Singer Kate Dunbar. A reactivated HUNTER VALLEY JAZZ CLUB

1963 HARBOURSIDE JAZZ CLUB

'The Dungeon' at the Trades Hall (Workers Club) housed the enigmatically organised club for more than 12 months. Bill Jones was the promoter, secretary, compere, manager, publicity officer and bandleader and eventually became my brother-in-law! The original Harbourside Six jazz band consisted of Bill Jones (Leader/Trombone/Vocals), Bob Henderson (trumpet) who went on to play with the Graeme Bell Band, Alan Ward (Clarinet/Sax) (Alan Ward Big Band), Milton Ward (who played piano at the Royal Newcastle Centre at JHH for a number of years), David Ross (drums) and Neville Jones (double bass).
